SLSC 2020 Rental Rules and Procedures

Rental Options

Boats will be available for rent from July 6 to Aug 22 for a total of 5 days per week. The days will depend on demand and the wind. We will make Saturday available, if the five weekdays have not all been used. There will be no rentals on Sunday. A rental agreement will be prepared and signed, by a parent if the sailors are under 18.

The rates are as follows:

Rental Period	Single Handed	Double Handed
Daily	\$20/day	\$30/day
Weekly	\$60/wk	\$75/wk
3 Weeks or More	\$50/wk	\$65/wk

Booking Procedures

 Everyone MUST book an arrival time at least 24 hours before the day you would like to sail. Send an email to <u>instructors@slsc.ca</u> to request a time slot. The instructors will get back to you to confirm your arrival time. You can view available times at the following Google Doc:

- 2. The number of boats launching per hour will be dependent on the current social gathering rules. Currently it is 10 people, and so 4 arrivals per hour will be allowed.
- 3. Arrival times available are 9:00, 10:00, 1:00, and 2:00.

Basic Ground Rules

- 1. Each boat must have at least one sailor who is in CanSail 3 or above, or is an experienced adult sailor. Only members of the same social circle, as defined by the latest government rules, are allowed in double handed boats.
- 2. In high winds, rentals will be restricted to more experienced sailors, at the discretion of the instructors.
- 3. Boats will not be allowed out in very low winds, if there is a chance of requiring a tow.
- 4. Social distancing of 2 metres must be maintained while on shore and on the water.
- 5. Use of the buildings (including the bathroom) will not be allowed, except to pickup and drop off equipment in assigned locations for each boat

On Land Procedures

- 1. The rigging equipment for each boat will be stored in an assigned space in the new boat house. Each space will be numbered and correspond to the numbered dock location of the boat. The instructors will control access to the boat house as you arrive.
- 2. For the weekly rentals, a numbered dock space will be allocated to the renter and the equipment will only be cleaned at the end of the rental period. For the daily rentals, the equipment will be cleaned at the end of the day.
- 3. Sailors will rig and go out on the water promptly when they arrive. When they come ashore, they will derig, store their equipment back in the assigned, numbered spot in the boathouse, and leave promptly.
- 4. On the last day of the rental period, you will not derig the boat when you come in. The instructors will do that when they wash the boats.
- 5. An instructor will be onsite to control access to the boats and to direct traffic in the lagoon. Only one boat will be allowed in the lagoon at a time.

On Water Procedures

- 1. Sailors must sail their boats responsibly.
- 2. Lifejackets and shoes must be worn at all times in the boats.
- 3. Sailors must stay in sight of the club or within boundaries defined by the instructor.
- 4. An instructor will be on the water in a crash boat for safety (but no instruction). This instructor will also control the timing of boats returning to the club to limit the number of people on shore. Instructors may, at some point, be able to provide some form of onwater coaching if current regulations change.
